

HCFS Spelling Curriculum 2024-2025

Higher up the school, in Key Stage Two, our spelling curriculum has **three integral cogs for spelling success**. Classes have three, 20-25 minute, spelling sessions and all sessions have a focus. Below you will find the cogs for success, spelling Scheme of Work and activity ideas. In addition to these ideas, EdShed has a wealth of games and spelling curriculum slides that match the HCFS Scheme of Work. Please note that unpicking patterns, looking at morphology or orthographic mapping has been proven by research to lead to better success than ‘Look, Cover, Write and Check’.

Session One – Introduce & Teach	The introduction section is designed to take approximately 25 minutes to complete. Here teachers and students will explore the words of the week. They will examine aspects such as the number of syllables, tricky sounds and the morphology of the words.	- introduce the new spelling words (explanation of how words are linked) - unpick the rule - exploring the etymology of the words - exploring the morphology of the words - sorting words into groups (based on different criteria - e.g. pronunciation of sounds) - Orthographic maps - breaking/sorting words into number of syllables - Segmenting words (using sound buttons or elkonin boxes) - Alphabetise	- Are there any mnemonics children could learn? - How can I make this engaging for the children?
Session Two – Practise & Consolidate	The practise and consolidate section allows time to revisit learning from the previous session and extend this by delving further into activities surrounding the spelling rule. Children are encouraged during this lesson to complete spelling based activities independently.	- revisit the spelling words and rule - creating word sheds - morphology matrix - cloze sentences - choosing the correct spelling - apply spellings in sentences (<i>oracy focus</i>)	How can I make the lessons engaging for pupils?
Session Three – Review	The review session will take place weekly and tests the pupils' spelling knowledge.
