

# How can I find out what my child will be and has been learning?

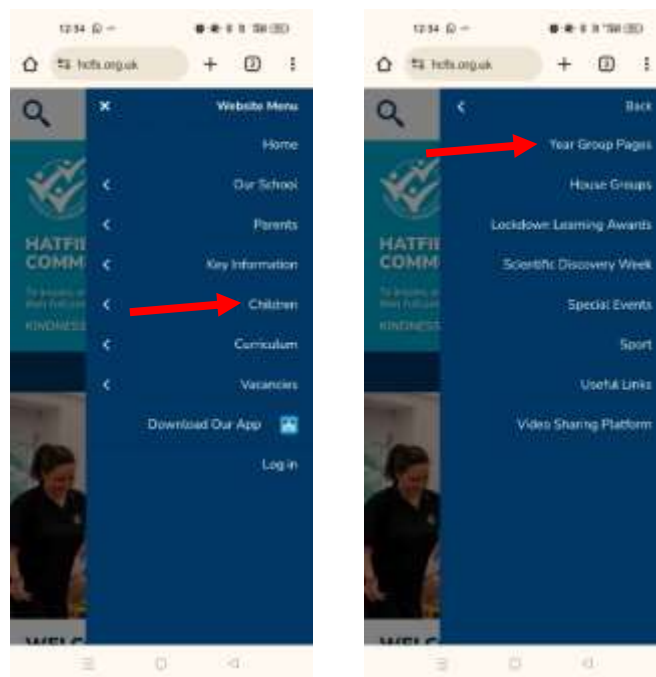


Year group pages can be viewed by directly accessing the school website.

From a laptop/computer, it would look like this:



And from a phone it would look like this:



Either of the above steps will take you to the specific year group page for your child. Once you are on these pages, if you scroll to the bottom, you will see these options:



## Curriculum

By clicking on the curriculum tab, you will have access to information about what your children will learn each half term. The teachers update this page on a half termly basis and the phase leaders email to notify you the page has been updated as well.



## Blog

By clicking on the blog tab, you will have access to the end of week update provided by the class teachers. This will give a brief overview of the key learning that has taken place in the classroom over the course of the week. We aim to have this page of the website updated by the end of every Friday.



## Homework

By clicking on the homework tab, you will have access to the half termly homework tasks. The teachers update this page on a half termly basis and notify you of this being done within The Week Ahead document.



## Photo Gallery

By clicking on this photo gallery tab, you will have access to some photos that have been taken of your children in school. The teams aim to update this on a termly basis and notify you of this being done within The Week Ahead document.

*These three pages can be used in conjunction to know:*

1. What your child will be learning about (in advance of it happening);
2. What your child has been learning about that week in school;
3. What learning your child would benefit from completing outside of school.

As a school, we really value face to face communication and therefore if you would like to know more about the learning your child will be or has been doing, then please do speak with your child's class teacher.
