Also, when parking on school grounds, please do not park in front of or block any access gates. These gates must be kept clear at all times to allow emergency vehicles immediate access to the site if required.

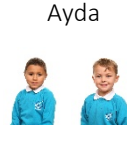

Robotics Week – A Fantastic Celebration of Innovation!

This week, our school was buzzing with excitement as we celebrated Robotics Week, giving pupils the chance to explore the fascinating world of technology, engineering and design.

Throughout the week, children took part in a range of hands-on, engaging activities. One highlight was using CAD (Computer-Aided Design) software to create detailed 3D models of houses on SketchUp for Schools. The pupils showed great creativity and problem-solving skills as they designed and visualised their own structures.

Another exciting activity involved designing and programming their own cars using specialist software. Once built, the cars were put to the test as students used Bluetooth remotes to race them, bringing plenty of energy and friendly competition to the classroom!

The carousel of robotics activities was particularly popular. Pupils had the opportunity to interact with a variety of robots, each with unique features. Some robots were programmed using Scratch, allowing children to write and test their own code, while others used cameras to recognise and respond to movement. A firm favourite was Pepper the robot, who could even be tickled, much to everyone's amusement!

A special highlight for Year 5 was the visit from a robot dog. The children were amazed as it performed a variety of tricks, demonstrating its advanced capabilities. Some lucky pupils even had the chance to race against the robot, making it a truly memorable experience.

Overall, Robotics Week was a tremendous success. The children thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to explore robotics in a fun and interactive way, and it was wonderful to see their curiosity, teamwork and enthusiasm in action.
